

Scrappy Color with Wedge Wonders

Workshop with Christina Cameli

Supply list

- Small scissors
- Large scissors
- Rotary cutter
- Pins
- Thread
- Colored pencils for planning your design. (optional)
- Ziplock or project bags to keep your cut wedges neat (optional)
- 3-in-1 Quilting Tool from C&T Publishing (optional)
- Sewing machine – remember to bring the power cord and pedal!
- 1/4" piecing foot
- A standard quilting ruler and mat (if these will not be provided)
- An iron and pressing station (if these will not be provided)
- Wedge ruler: See the attached 9-degree ruler for printing (cut out two copies of the wedge template precisely **and bring a roll of scotch tape** to attach to your ruler), or you can use any wedge ruler that you have. If using your own ruler, you may have to adjust cutting or assembly instructions.

Fabric Selection

Overall: Bring the fabric that makes you want to play! This is a fun class don't stress.

For the first part of the day we will be working with scraps to create pieced strips. Your scraps can be any size, but if you want what you make to work in the second half of the day, the scraps should be at least 1" wide and 3" long. Please make sure you have at least a shoebox amount of scraps to work with. (If you don't have enough, or feel like you need more variety, check in with quilting friends - they generally have more than enough to share! The more variety in your scraps the better!)

For the second part of the day, we will work on a piece that will measure 26" to 36" when finished.

For the wedge round – consider these approaches, or make your own:

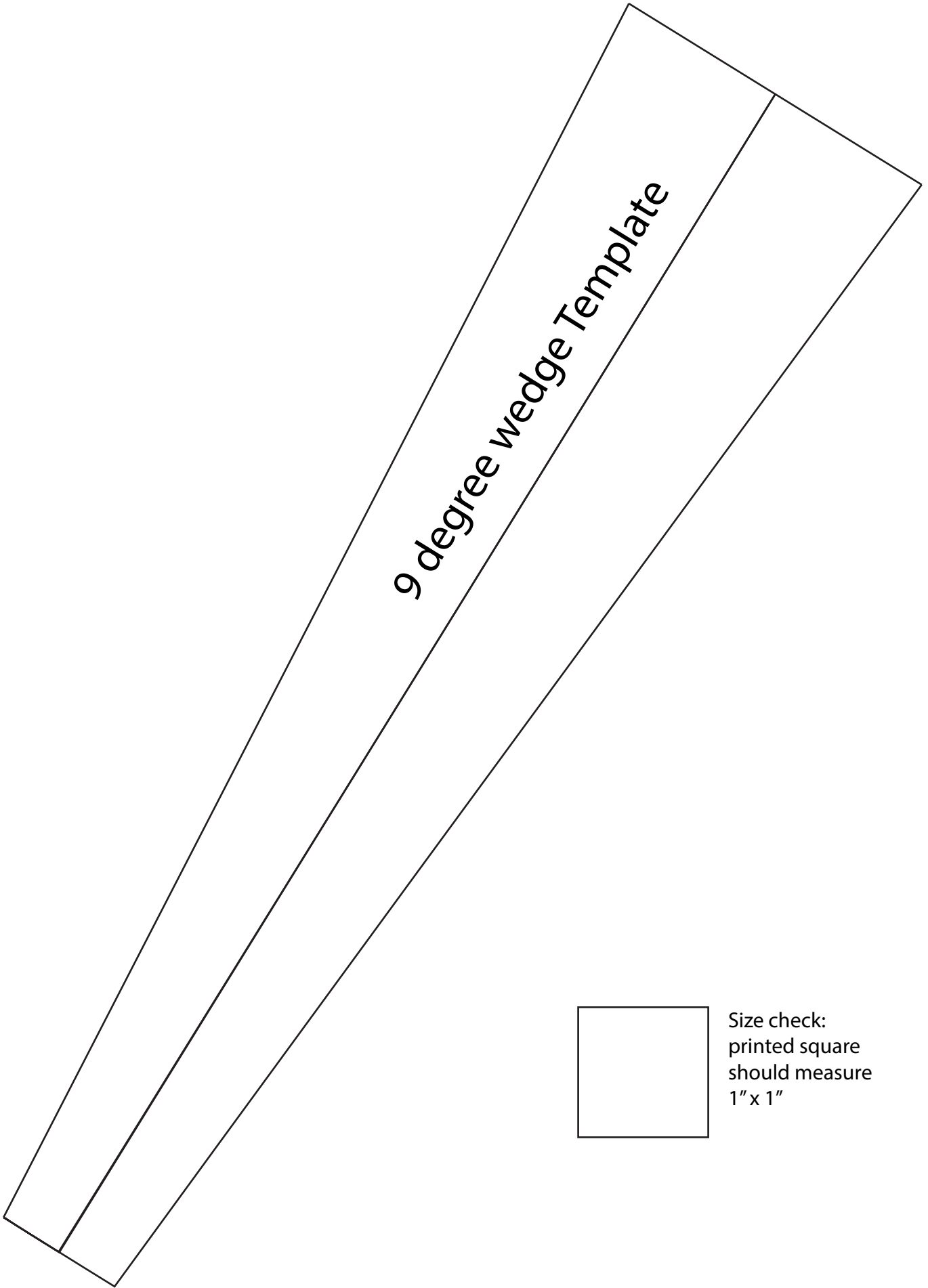
1. If you have a fabric pull already in mind, bring 6 or more coordinating strips 10 1/2" wide across the width of fabric (40"+)
2. If you're not sure – select 10 or more fat quarters, enough to give you options.

3. For a minimalist approach, bring at least 1 yard each of 2 colors.

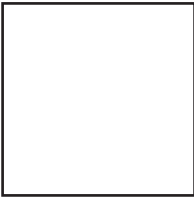
If you are doing option 1 or 2 above, also bring a background color (1-2 yards)

Additional information for ultra-planners:

- It will take 40 wedges to make a complete wedge round.
- Most people will cut multiple wedges from the same fabric. Your fabric strips should be 10 1/2" wide if you are doing this. You can cut 14-18 wedges from a 10 1/2" width of fabric strip, depending on ruler alignment.
- If you prefer to cut each wedge individually from scraps, scrap pieces must be at least 10 1/2" tall and at least 3" wide to work with the template.
